- **II.** Secretary's Report Sharry: Gene moved to accept the minutes sent out by email and Mel seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
- **III.** Treasurer's Report Gene: Sharry moved to accept the financials and Mel seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

It's a program for kids 7-11 years of age and fairly popular. They average 12-16 registrants but the last class only had 7 probably due to the end of the school year and sports starting.

3 Crime Prevention Lectures: Tom Kaczmarek of the Manatee County Sheriff's Office. Free

Deputy Kaczmarek has 20 years of experience serving 7 years as a Detective. While serving as a Detective, Deputy Kaczmarek investigated numerous cases that involved fraud, elderly exploration contractor fraud, property crimes and criminal statewide trends. Deputy Kaczmarek holds a current designation from the Attorney General's Office of Florida. Deputy Kaczmarek through his investigations, has seen many cases successfully prosecuted not only in Manatee County, but other jurisdictions. The topics covered will be from his experience and interviews with suspects, who typically commit these crimes against citizens in our area.

1) June 13 @ 1:00 PM: Fraud and Scams.

This lecture covers fraud and scams that plague our community and victimize citizens, including online scams.

2) August 7 @ 1:00 PM: Residential Security.

This lecture discusses steps needed to secure our residence and help limit the chances of being a victim.

3) September 12 @ 1:00: Active Shooters.

This lecture discusses methods needed to help survive an active assailant attack. This covers the run, hide, fight program.
